National Initiative VIII Reaches Mid-Point

Twenty-seven AIAMC-member institutions representing 34 teams have reached the nine-month mark of the 18-month National Initiative VIII: *Justice, Equity, Diversity, Inclusion*. Following pre-work in the summer of 2021, National Initiative (NI) VIII officially kicked off in October with a virtual meeting of all participants. Ninety team members were motivated and challenged by the riveting keynote address *Social and Moral Determinants of Health* presented by Donald Berwick, MD, MPP, President Emeritus and Senior Fellow, Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI). This was followed by *Evaluation Driving Curriculum,* which included didactic sessions and breakout room discussions. The day closed with members of the National Advisory Council (NAC) providing their reflections and reactions. The 34 NI projects were divided into the following categories: curriculum development, workforce development, and clinical QI. Five cohorts of approximately six to seven teams each began meeting via Zoom in

November and have met four times in the past nine months, sharing progress and networking with other team leaders. In addition to the cohort meetings, three didactic



webinars have been presented on the following topics: *The Proximity Project and AIAMC's Distinction in Diversity, Understanding Data Analysis for Research and Quality Improvement, and Publication and Scholarly Activity.* Meeting Two was held in late March in New Orleans, and 93 NI VIII team members attended (59 in-person and 34 virtually). NAC members provided the keynote address, followed by cohort meetings and presentation of project storyboards. The Committee on the Integration of Academics and Quality (CIAQ) is led by NI VIII Co-Chairs David Kountz, MD, MBA, FACP, Vice President, Academic Affairs and Co-Chief Academic Officer at Hackensack Meridian Health and Virginia "Ginny" Mohl, MD, PhD, DIO and Medical Director of Education at Billings Clinic. CIAQ is currently planning the program for Meeting Three, which will be held on October 14th in Chicago. We commend the great work of these teams in addressing Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion!
