AACOM GME Development Fellowship:
Building Capacity for Community-Based GME

The American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM), in partnership with the UNC Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research, is now accepting applications for the second cohort of its Graduate Medical Education (GME) Development Fellowship—a 10-month interactive program designed to develop leaders in GME expansion, with a special focus on rural and underserved areas.

Fellows engage in monthly virtual sessions, receive mentoring from GME experts, and complete a capstone project tailored to their institution's needs. Topics include GME financing, accreditation, Medicaid GME, rural tracks, and innovative partnerships with FQHCs, Tribal health systems, and Veterans Affairs. The program culminates in a capstone presentation at AACOM's *Educating Leaders* conference.

The fellowship directly supports AACOM's commitment to expanding clinical training and residency opportunities for all medical students by strengthening the nation's GME infrastructure and addressing physician workforce gaps. The inaugural cohort launched new programs, developed new sponsoring institutions, and forged cross-sector partnerships that are already increasing training capacity.

The fellowship is ideal for DIOs, GME deans, clinical leadership, and other stakeholders involved in GME growth. In its first year, the program supported the development of new GME programs, statewide partnerships, and the launch of several new sponsoring institutions.
