First Meeting of NI VII Held in Chicago

113 AIAMC members and friends gathered at the Omni Chicago Hotel on October 10th and 11th for the first meeting of National Initiative VII: *Teaming for Interprofessional Collaborative Practice*. Following a networking lunch and opening remarks by NI VII Chair Hania Janek, PhD, Vice President Education, Baylor Scott & White Health, the meeting opened with keynote speaker Mike Barger, EdD. Dr. Barger, Executive Director, Office of Strategy and Academic Innovation—Stephen M. Ross School of Business at



the University of Michigan and a founding member of JetBlue Airways, challenged the audience to better understand the concept of teaming through various publications and successful examples. A reactor panel made up of AIAMC National Advisory Council (NAC) members then shared their comments and key learnings. NAC members serving on the reactor panel were John Andrews, MD, Vice President, GME Innovations, American Medical Association; Elisa Arespacochaga, Vice President, Physician Alliance, American Hospital Association; Robyn Begley, DNP, RN, NEA-BC, Chief Executive Officer, American Organization for Nursing Leadership; Dimitra Travlos, PharmD, Assistant Executive Director and Director, Continuing Pharmacy Education Provider Accreditation; and Robin Wagner, RN, MHSA, Sr. Vice President, CLER, Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. The afternoon concluded with a time capsule table-top exercise and review of toolkits in monthly cohort breakout groups. Friday morning's sessions focused on measurement, with Dr. Janek and C. Craige Blackmore, MD, MPH, Director, Center for Health Care Improvement Science, Virginia Mason Medical Center, presenting "National Initiative VII Logic Model and Implications". Cohort groups reviewed their measurement plans in breakout sessions and determined where shared measurement tools and resources may be implemented. The morning concluded with introductions to the Project Management Plan and NI VII Roadmap. The 30 institutional teams met throughout the hotel to begin development of their project management plans before returning to the ballroom for feedback and meeting wrapup. The next on-site meeting will take place March 27-28, 2020 in Austin, TX.
