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National Initiative News

The third meeting of National initiative VIII *JEDI: Justice, Equity, Diversity, Inclusion* was held on Friday, October 14th at the Omni Chicago Hotel. The keynote address *Beyond Awareness: Creative Communications to Connect with Your Community* was presented by Kiki L'Italien, Senior Consultant, Tecker International. Consistent with prior meetings, the cohort groups which met in breakout rooms was a conference highlight. Team leaders shared their storyboards, identified barriers, and discussed potential solutions. Ample time was provided for institutional teams to meet, review their progress, and set goals for project completion in March 2023. The fourth and final meeting of National Initiative VIII will be held March 24-25 at the Loews Vanderbilt Hotel in Nashville.



Member Value Assessment Results

We thank our members who recently completed the online *Member Value Assessment*. Thirty-one percent of AIAMC-member institutions were represented. “Programs and Events” were the #1 most valued member benefit, with feedback regarding value of benefits by major category as follows:

These scores represent a 5-point Likert scale, with 5 being “most valuable”. When asked to rate specific examples within the major category of “Programs and Events”, the Annual Meeting was ranked highest with a weighted average score of 4.69, followed by the National Initiatives at 4.64, and webinars at 3.64. Similarly, examples of “Networking and Collaboration” were ranked as follows: in-person connections 4.52, getting involved 4.37, and facilitated networking 4.21. This feedback will help the AIAMC Board develop a three-year strategic plan. We want to be sure we continue providing and improving the benefits you value most!
