National Initiative IX Teams Announced

Twenty-three AIAMC-member institutions representing 29 team projects have been selected to participate in the AIAMC's National Initiative IX: Addressing the Social and Moral Determinants of Health. These hospitals and health systems span the United States from Washington State to Florida (see sidebar). The AIAMC National Initiative (NI) is the only national and multi-institutional collaborative of its kind in which residents lead multidisciplinary teams in quality improvement projects aligned to their institution's strategic goals. Sixty-nine hospitals and health systems and nearly 1,400 individuals have participated in the AIAMC National Initiatives since 2007, driving change that has resulted in meaningful and sustainable outcomes improving the quality and safety of patient care. Selections were based upon demonstrated commitment to better understanding of local social and moral determinants of health and providing patient care that is equitable for all. These teams will develop

and implement projects that will positively impact both individual performance and institutional equity. Participants will attend four learning sessions as well as monthly networking zoom



meetings and educational webinars during the 18-month Initiative. The Committee on the Integration of Academics and Quality (CIAQ) is led by NI IX Co--Chairs Rajiv Gala, MD, Designated Institutional Official (DIO) at Ochsner Health and James "JP" Orlando, EdD, Chief Graduate Medical Education Officer and DIO at St. Luke's University Health Network. CIAQ has approved the summer pre-work of teams and is busy planning the first meeting, which will be held at the Omni Chicago Hotel on October 13th. "While most leaders in the US healthcare system acknowledge the importance of social and moral determinants of health, few organizations to date have moved beyond recognition into serious action at scale" states Donald Berwick, MD, MPP, President Emeritus, Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI). He continues, "Thank you, AIAMC, for being such a pace-setter!"
